Water Safety Program

This program is designed to protect non-swimmers because we care about the people who use our pool.

- 1 Parents or guardians are responsible for supervising their children. Lifeguards are on duty to enforce rules and to respond in case of an emergency.
- 2 48 inches tall and under must wear a life jacket or pass a swim test administered by a Jones Center lifeguard.
- 3 14 years and under must wear a life jacket if entering the lap pool unless they have passed a swim test. It is acceptable to for 8-14 year olds to enter the leisure pool without a lifejacket due to the depth only being up to 3'8".
- 4 If a child has a life jacket on then they are free to enter any part of the pools.
- 5 It is difficult for a child to learn to swim with a life jacket on. Guardians may use one of the lap pool lanes to teach their child to swim during public swim times. They must be within arm's reach of their guardian at all times.
- 6 There is a designated area at the zero entry of the leisure pool that children do not have to wear a lifejacket due to the depth only being up to 1'6".
- 7 Swim Test: the swim test consist of 2 parts. First, a person must be able to swim the length of the pool (25 yards) without touching bottom, the wall, or lane ropes. Second, the person must be able to tread water for 30 seconds in the deep end of the pool.
